A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Greetings Rahway Residents!

Welcome to the Spring edition of the Rahway Review. This edition highlights our city's accomplishments and initiatives, and the many ways I as Mayor, my administration and our City Council have—and will continue to—move Rahway forward.

Highlighting our municipal services...from our COVID19 response and the collective sacrifices of the community to save lives, to helping Rahway businesses sustain the financial effects of pandemic restrictions; stabilizing the tax structure and efficiency executing daily municipal services; sustaining community programs and proper development of our city's infrastructure; and investments in public safety including Police, Fire, EMS, and DPW within a community-first mindset...Rahway city government works for you.

Early in my term as Mayor, I asked my directors to continue providing a high level of essential services to our residents without increasing taxes. While our property taxes also include school, county, and library components, the portion that we control - the municipal component - was not increased in 2021.

I'm also proud to announce that my administration will present to the

City Council a 2022 budget which again will result in a 0% municipal tax increase. This achievement demonstrates our ability to be fiscally responsible while we continue to find additional ways to increase revenue and efficiency for our residents.

In this issue, you will find municipal budget statistics highlighting how your municipal tax dollars are working for you, and a comparison of tax rates over recent years. You will also find snapshots of how the various departments of City Hall worked to ensure a swift and efficient COVID19 response as well as disaster relief during and the days following Hurricane Ida.

As we prepare for Rahway's post-pandemic future, we'll do so in a proactive manner. Looking ahead, this issue offers insight into the work of our restructured Special Improvement District to increase the impact of true economic development efforts for our businesses; features programs and services for our seniors; highlights our investments in community gathering spaces and infrastructure; and presents a full calendar of Spring events.

Throughout May and June, the Mayor's Music Series will showcase

local, live musicians every Friday and Saturday night downtown. Throughout the summer, AB Salute House will host their widely popular House Music Festivals in the Rahway Recreation Center parking lot. The annual Mayor's Concert Series closes out our summer outdoor concerts in August.

One of Rahway's longest running and most popular events, Hot Rods and Harleys is just a few weeks away on May 14th. In addition, the City of Rahway is partnering with the Rahway Social Justice Commission to celebrate Juneteenth, and the Rahway Environmental Commission and the Rahway River Watershed Association to host the second annual Riverfest on June 25th

It has been said that "If you want to experience significant progress toward your goal, you need to be intentional about the work you're doing every day." That notion is a guiding principle for me as your Mayor and for our City Council.

I look forward to seeing all of our Rahway residents throughout the City in the upcoming months - and when you do see me, make sure to say hello.






Recap of Rahway's Soup Stroll As 20 different restaurants took part in the 2022 Soup Stroll, 5,500 FREE samples of soup were distributed.





Prescription Assistance

The annual income limits of two state-funded prescription drug benefit programs increased by \$10,000 in 2022.

Pharmaceutical Assistance for the Aged and Disabled (PAAD)

For seniors 65+ and adults with disabilities with income up to \$38,769 if single, \$45,720 if married.

Costs for prescriptions covered under this program may be as low as \$5 or \$7.

The program may also pay your Medicare Part D monthly premium.

You may also be eligible for a \$225 utility credit.

Senior Gold Prescription Drug Discount Program

Cut your prescription costs in half after a \$15 co-pay. For residents age 65+ and adults with disabilities with incomes up to \$48,769 if single, \$55,720 if married. Applications are available at the Senior Center.

Celebrating Ann Quigley

Mayor Raymond Giacobbe, the Rahway City Council, and the community congratulate Ann Quigley on her 100th birthday!

Ann Quigley was born Anna Cardillo in February 1922 in Newark, NJ. She was the 2nd of 5 children. She had an older and younger sister and two younger brothers. Her mom was a very giving person and would help as many people as she could. As a child Ann liked playing with her siblings and her favorite game was jacks. She really enjoyed watching her father, who worked on the railroad, doing chores around the house. She specifically enjoyed watching him paint and wondered if this was an indication of her future interest in art. Whenever he would paint the walls in a room, Ann was fascinated by it all and just wanted to pick up a brush and paint. Ann's family owned a piano and she liked to tinker on it and took lessons for about a year, but her real interest was art. Ann enjoyed school and in her junior year she left public school to attend the secretarial program at Blessed Sacrament in Newark.

Before her 17th birthday, a girl friend introduced her to a young man over the phone. After talking he asked to meet her in person and it was love at first sight. His name was Herbert E. Quigley and they were married in 6 months after her graduation from high school. They settled down in Newark and Ann gave birth to 2 boys. They then moved to Irvington

where they had their third child, a girl. In 1979 Ann and her husband moved to Rahway where she has lived for the last 40 years.

Ann was a longtime member of a church choir singing during evening services. Ann enjoyed attending mass at St. Mary's until she stopped driving. Ann has 7 grandchildren and 7 great grandchildren with an 8th on the way. Education has always been very important in her life and she impressed the importance of education to her children. She worked at the offices of Hatfield and Wire in Hillside and upon retiring starting visiting the Rahway Senior Center. To this day she is still active at the Rahway Senior Center and comes to classes 3 times a week.

Ann disassembled a picnic table that was the setting for many happy family gatherings with her children and grandchildren. She later painted lighthouses on the worn pieces of wood and gifted a painting to all her grandchildren. Ann was ahead of her time with recycling. Ann is a talented painter and has shown her art in many shows at the Senior Center where she has been coming for over 30 years. She has made many friends over the years at the Senior Center and lights up the room when she enters.

Property Tax Reimbursement

The Property Tax Reimbursement Program reimburses eligible senior citizens and disabled persons for property tax increases on their principal residence. This state program "freezes" your taxes the year you become eligible and every year you are reimbursed the difference. You must be 65 by 12/31/2019 or receiving federal Social Security disability benefits, lived in NJ for 10 years and in your current home for the last three years. The income limit for 2021 is \$94,178 and includes income that is not reported on a NJ tax return, such as social security benefits, disability benefits and tax exempt interest. If you are not currently enrolled in this program, please call 1-800-882-6597 and request a PTR-1 booklet. If you need assistance filling out the PTR-1, please call (732)827-2016 and make an appointment with an AARP tax specialist.

Program Registration

The Rahway Senior Center offers a variety of exercise, craft, art, as well as, memoir writing and meditation classes that will start on April 25. You may register at the Senior Center, Recreation Center or online at www.cityofrahway.org. Most programs are \$5 for Rahway residents age 60+. Adult Rahway residents may register at the regular adult fee.






Municipal Budget Revenue 2021, \$58,643,736









CITY OF RAHWAY GRANTS

Mayor Raymond Giacobbe and his administration actively pursue grant funding to ensure City projects are achieved without raising taxes. Some examples of how the City implements grant funding:




Union County History, Education, Arts Reaching Thousands (HEART) Grant Received for 2021 \$2,500.00



The City partnered with the Social Justice Commission (SJC) to present a speaker series focused on social justice and equity in the workplace.



In January 2021, we received a \$1,953 portion of a grant from Amazon by way of United Way of Greater Union County. This money was used to purchase meals from local restaurants as part of the Be Our Valentine meal delivery initiative for seniors.



Economic Development Grants

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Accomplishments for Program Year (PY)46, September 2020 - August 2021; PY47, September 2021 - August 2022.

- Road Improvement Program (PY46 \$270,000; PY47 \$278,000) PY46 funds were used to successfully milled and paved Kaminski Drive (Jefferson Ave to St Georges Ave) and Moses Drive (Jefferson Ave to St Georges Ave). Appropriate striping and curb cuts were also inserted as well. PY47 funds will be used to resurface Whelan Place (E Hazelwood Ave to Randolph Ave), Clark Street (E Hazelwood Ave to Randolph Ave) and Lufberry Street (E Scott Ave to E Grand Ave) during 2022.
- Home Improvement Program (PY46 \$304,000; PY47 \$304,000) PY46 funds were used to repair 12 Rahway homes for qualifying low and moderate income residents based on federal income requirements. 5 of the homes were senior owned. Repairs include the fixing of roofs, gutters and leaders, windows and doors, heating, plumbing, painting, kitchens and electrical work. PY47 funds will be used to repair approximately 15 Rahway homes for low and moderate income residents and seniors throughout 2022.
- Code Enforcement Program (PY46 \$27,000; PY47 \$24,000) PY46 funds were used to pay for part of the salary of a code enforcement official, who successfully inspected 228 Rahway households. These inspections included Certificates of Continued Occupancy, tenant and property maintenance, neighbor complaints, and fire safety inspections. PY47 funds will be used to continue to pay part of the salary of a code enforcement official, who will inspect approximately 200+ Rahway households during 2022.
- Senior Public Services Program (PY46 \$14,250; PY47 \$14,250) PY46 funds were used to benefit roughly 1223 Rahway seniors. These funds were used to pay for senior meals, supplies for senior activities, including: craft supplies and cabinets for the senior center. Successful programs included tax preparation assistance, 420 Valentine's Day meals being distributed to local seniors, 317 meals for the senior picnic. **PY47** funds will be used to benefit approximately 1,000+ Rahway seniors for 2022.
- Policy & Planning (PY46 \$105,000; PY47 \$105,000) PY46 funds were spent on the salary of the Grant Administrator to successfully administer and execute the City of Rahway's entire CDBG Program, PY47 funds will also be used for the Grant Administrator's salary for 2022.
